RURAL PRIMARY EYE CARE, FROM ZITHULELE HOSPITAL

Grace Vision aims to reduce the prevalence of low vision and blindness due to cataract by providing comprehensive eye care to communities for whom medical care is unaffordable.

Fully equipped mobile eye screening vehicles travel the rural areas to offer eye screening to community members to determine what treatment they need.

At the facility in the Eastern Cape, low-cost, high-volume yet highly efficient cataract surgeries are performed.

HLOKOMELA WELLNESS CLINIC

Hlokomela is an HIV/AIDS educational and treatment programme targeting workers in the agriculture, nature conservation and tourism sectors in Hoedspruit, Limpopo.

Their accredited clinics provide treatment for HIV/AIDS, ultra-sounds for breast cancer prevention and detection, chronic medication, and general wellness services. The clinic also has been in joint outreaches providing women access to birth control, pap smears and STI treatment.

Supporting CHOC in their mission to provide care and support to children with cancer comes in many forms.

A portion of the Charlotte Maxeke Johannesburg Academic Hospital, was lost to fire. This disrupted the research efforts and created additional challenges in providing optimal patient care.

Adcock Ingram's involvement assisted in initiating the rebuilding of the Paediatric Oncology Unit, which will enhance the ability to deliver healthcare services and continue research work.

HEALING THE HENNOPS

The Hennops River is one of the largest rivers that drains Gauteng, South Africa. The two main problems the river faces in terms of pollution are illegal dumping and industrial effluent.

Since November 2019, Hennops Revival has removed more than 3 273 tons of trash and a total of 132 177 bags have been collected.
